He worked also with the Central electronic Engineering Research Institute, Pilani; civil Aviation Department, Bombay and Physical Research Laboratory, Ahmedabad. He also worked with the Oil and Natural Gas Commission to supervise the design, development, operation and repair of geophysical and communication instruments and other electronic instruments. The many accomplishments in his long career include design and development of audio-acoustic circuits; operation, repair and maintenance of ILS, VOR, AD-200 and other navigational aids and development of "payloads" for rockets to monitor the lower atmosphere.
